HMICFRS finds policing is 'under significant stress'

The latest annual police efficiency report led by HMI Mike Cunningham (above) [recognises that 'the pressures you face are significant and increasingly complex'](#). Steve White, your national Chair said the report echoes what we have been saying repeatedly and that the findings were "no real surprise," and reported on issues "which we have been highlighting for years - there is nothing new here, the question now is what will happen on the back of it and how will Chief Officers react?"

Metropolitan officer Charlie Guenigault and British Transport Police officer Wayne Marques both suffered horrific injuries when, unarmed, they confronted three terrorists during the London Bridge attack on 3 June. The Daily Mail and The Sun are calling for the officers to be awarded the UK's top non-military medal the George Cross (above).

However, after years of campaigning we have secured agreement from the Ministry of Justice, Home Office, Crown Prosecution Service, Department for Transport, IPCC and also the NPCC that a change in legislation is required."
