

GP Health Record

Your patient summary shows:

- Medicines your GP has prescribed
- Allergies you have
- Vaccinations you have had
- Conditions you have been diagnosed with
- Notes from appointments at your GP surgery
- Results of tests your GP surgery has arranged
- Letters that hospitals or specialists have sent to your GP

The Police Treatment Centres accept GP Health Records for our residential physiotherapy programme only.

We request that GP Health Records are sent electronically with your application for treatment.

Your GP Health Record gives our clinicians an overview of your recent medical care and will help them to triage your application for treatment. Our clinicians may still require further information to support your application.

If you can provide your GP Health Record, a clinician is not required to complete part four and five of your application, as long as the record contains clinical reference to what you are applying for treatment with.

If you are unable to, or do not wish to provide your GP Health Record, then a clinician is required to complete part four and five of your application form.

You can request that your GP redacts unnecessary information from your record before you send it to our clinicians if you wish.

How to access your GP Health Record:

- If you have access to the NHS App, you can send an administrative request / message to ask for your GP Health Record from your GP. This can be provided electronically.
- Contact your GP surgery by telephone or in person and ask the reception team to print or email your GP Health Record to you.
